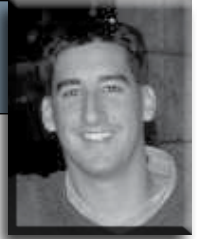

In late July 2010 The Buick Club of America hosted the 39th BCA National Meet at Ames, Iowa on the campus of Iowa State University. Approximately 350+ Buicks descended on the college town just north of Des Moines. Carolina Chapter members in attendance include Doug Seybold and myself, Doug with his 1940 Super Estate Wagon and I was sans Buick. Instead of being hosted by an individual chapter this event was hosted by BCA BOD members Bill Stoneberg and Rick Young with volunteers from the Hawkeye and Gopher State chapters. It was also the first time in BCA history that the 400 pt judging was held on Friday instead of Saturday.

Due to my BOD responsibilities I was not able to make the tours planned for Wednesday and Thursday however I was able to bum a ride from Ben Bruce, a BCA friend from MO, to the Jewell, IA cruise on Friday night. Jewell, IA is the hometown of our current BCA President Rick Young and most of the attending Buicks made the 30 minute drive from Ames to Jewell, where we lined the streets of downtown with Buicks. A stage and band played while we feasted on pork and sweet corn. The Reatta division received their award as the chapter/division to attract the most new members to the BCA. It was a very enjoyable night.

Saturday there were several activities planned to keep everyone entertained until the banquet that night. First and foremost was the driven class show was on Saturday and due to the Friday 400 pt judging cars were allowed to enter both the 400pt on Friday and the driven class Saturday resulting in the largest participation in the driven class to date. Also there was an open car show on Saturday to benefit the Make a wish foundation and it ended up raising over \$3000 towards that charity.

I had to leave prior to the banquet, but I understand it went well and your truly managed to bring home some hardware despite not having a Buick at the show. I won the 2010 Gerstkemper award for the individual attracting the most new members to the BCA. I received a plaque, jacket and \$500 prize. The prize money I donated back to the BCA and you will find more on that in the Bugle soon. Jerry Bodden won this award a few years back and the chapter continues to grow.

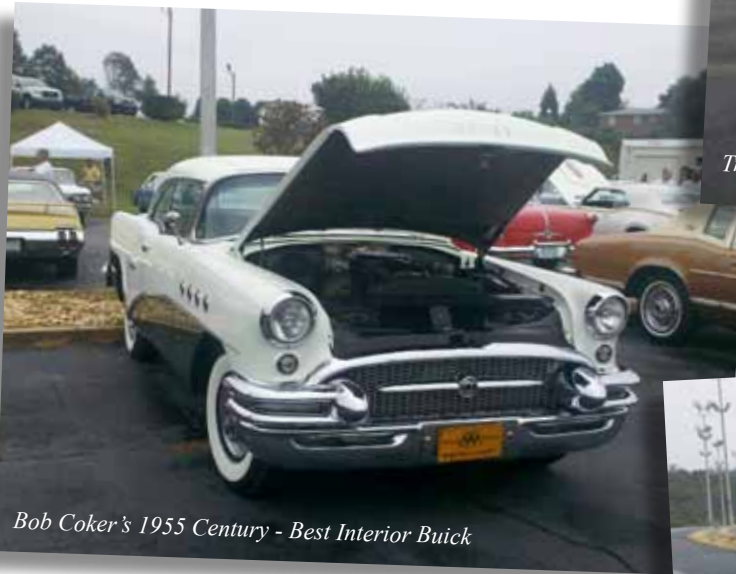

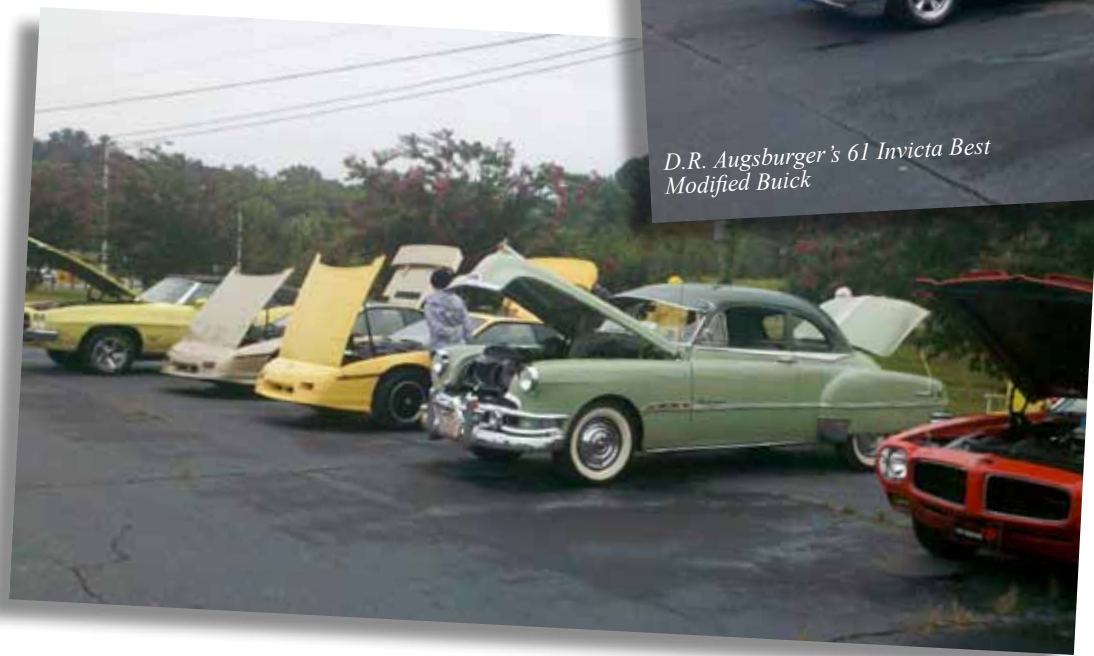

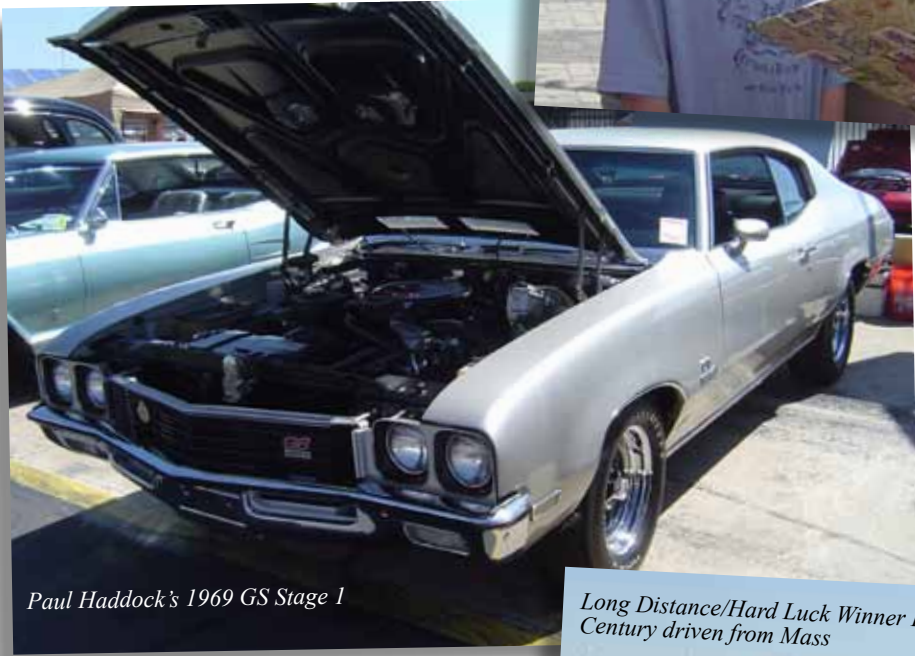
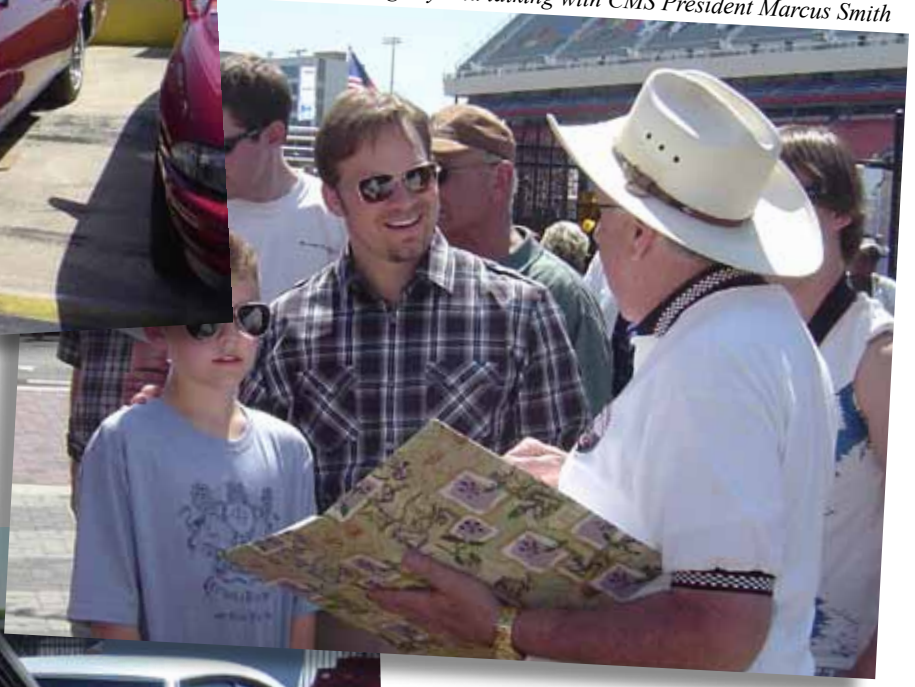

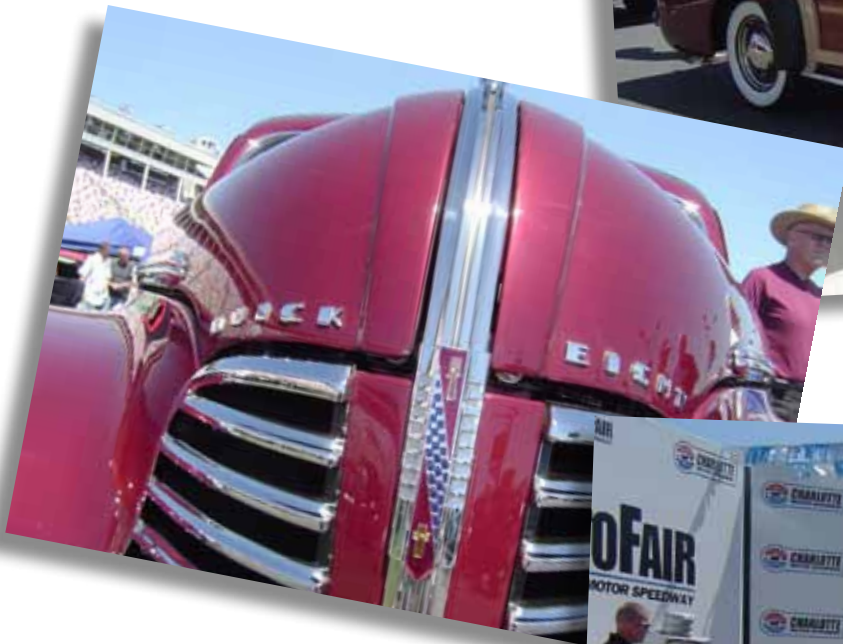
